

Tertullian

While he was still a Catholic, during the time of secutions before the legalization of Christianity in the Roman Empire, Tertullian wrote the only complete work on a sacrament of baptism. This treatise, _____, is a powerful defense of baptismal regeneration. Specifically, he refutes those who claim that faith in Christ alone (apart from the sacrament of baptism) is he forgiveness of sins and spiritual r birth described by Christ in John 3:3

"A treatise on our sacrament of water, by which the sins of our earlier blindness are washed away and we are released for eternal life will not be superfluous. . . . [t]aking away death by the washing away of sins. The guilt being removed, the penalty, of course, is also r moved. . . . Baptism itself is a corporal act by which we are plunged into the water, while its effect is spiritual, are freed from our sin (On Baptism 1:1; 5:6; 7:2 [circa A.D. 198]).

"Good enough, but faith means faith in all Christ did and said to do, so it includes being baptized. . . . And so they say, 'Baptism is not necessary to them to whom faith is sufficient, for after all, Abraham pleased God by no sacrament of water, but of faith.' But in all cases it is the later precedent that proves the point. Grant, for the sake of argument, that in days gone by, there was salvation by means of bare faith, before the urrection of the Lord. But now that faith has been enlarged, and has become a faith which believes in His Nativity, Passion, and there has been an amplification added to the faith; this is the sealing act of baptism.

The main meaning of this parable has to do with the contrast between the great and the small. The seed of the Kingdom od on earth is something very tiny to begin with (Lk 12:32; Acts 1:15); but it will grow to be a big tree. Thus we see small initial group of disciples grows in the early years of the Church (cf Acts 2:47; 6:7; 12:24), and spreads down es and becomes a great multitude "which no man could number" (Rev 7:9).

This mysterious growth which our Lord refers to also occurs in each soul: "the Kingdom of God is in the midst of you" (Lk 17:21); we can see a prediction of this in the words of Psalm 92:12: "The righteous grow like a cedar in Leb non." To allow the mercy of God to exalt us, to make us grow, we must make ourselves small, humble (Ezek 17:22

"The Lord was baptized, not to be cleansed himself he waters, so that those waters, cleansed by the Flesh of Christ which knew no sin, might have the power of baptism. Whoever comes, therefore, to the washing of Christ lays aside his sins." the Gospel of Luke 2:83 [circa A.D. 389]).

"How then shall we be able to give an account of the unseen birth by baptism, which is far more exalted than these?... Even angels stand in awe while that birth takes place . . . the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit work Let us then believe the declaration of God, for that is more trustworthy than actual seeing. The sight often

is in error, but God's Word cannot fail; let us then b

lieve it. . . . What then does it say? That what happens is a birth. . . . If any inquire, 'Why is water needed?' let us return, 'Why did God use earth to form man?'. . . curious. That the need of water is abs lute and indispensable you may learn in this (Homily 25 on John 2 [A.D. 391]).

Baptism is not merely an external sign of faith a ready possessed by the one to be baptized; it is the power of God cleansing the soul of the sinner, even in the case of infants:
